## A message from our School Governors:

The governors of our school take their voluntary role seriously, and work hard to support our nursery and its community. The governors work within one or more sub committees such as Premises, Finance and Curriculum that meet at least once per term with all the governors coming together for a Full Governor Meeting at the end of each term. This year governors have undertaken termly learning walks based around the new Early Years curriculum, ensured the school website is up to date and undertaken appropriate training.
